Family Handbook Overview


- Available on website Policies & Procedures or printed copies at school
- Birthdays no treats or prizes brought to school.
- No treats or candy provided in class unless the teacher completes paperwork and gets parent permission
- Toys bring toys to play at recess at their own risk.
 - o If they are a distraction teachers will confiscate them.
 - o Bridge will not use any resources to find lost or stolen toys or help fix or replace broken toys.
- Scooter Path manual scooters only WITH helmet
- Recess will be outside unless it is less than 20F or really wet or really windy
- Medication can only be given at school with appropriate paperwork
- Grading is based on MASTERY PLEASE READ in handbook!

Visible Learning Traits - John Hattie etal

Weekly lessons with our Visible Learning specialist help students embrace these six traits. Emphasized trait also discussed in weekly newsletter for parents to use same verbiage at home. John Hattie and others have identified these traits as having a significant impact on student achievement.

Security

- All exterior doors except front door always locked

- PLEASE read provides announcements of upcoming events

- Frequent emails from teachers and occasionally administration PLEASE read them so your student doesn't miss out on an event or
 activity
- Some teachers use ClassTag or other apps to correspond with parents -PLEASE read what they send

Volunteers

Attendance

It is SUPER important to let the school know if your child will be absent:

ASPIRE - Student Information System

- Use to check grades and attendance
 - Grades Semester System posted in January and June
 - Attendance taken daily PRIOR to 8:45 am and phone calls made to missing students
- Apply for FREE / REDUCED lunch status
 - This is SUPER IMPORTANT in the event we have to begin charging for meals and also...
 - The school is provided TITLE | FUNDS based on our free/reduced status
 - Funds used for At-Risk Coordinator for before and after school programs
 - Funds used to support intervention efforts for struggling students
 - Parent/Student/School compact

Check Out

- ASPIRE tells us WHO has permission to check your child out of school
- Visit the front office if you want to ensure accuracy
- Individuals MUST show picture ID to check out a student
 - We will NOT release a student without picture ID or if the individual is NOT listed in ASPIRE as being able to check out the student.

Parking Lot and Pick Up

- Traffic flow is on our website (Our School)
- Drop off is not too bad since it is an hour long
- Pick up is ROUGH on short day PLEASE BE PATIENT COURTEOUS STAY OFF YOUR PHONE
- Pick up at 3:40 takes about 15 minutes PLEASE BE PATIENT COURTEOUS
 STAY OFF YOUR PHONE
- Pick up at 4:30 takes about 10 minutes
- DO NOT PARK AT PHARMACY they are angry and call it trespassing
- DO NOT EVER park across the street and motion your kiddos across! The curb is red!
- PLEASE help us keep everyone safe!

First Day of School for ALL Students

Wednesday - August 17 Drop off 8:00 am - 9:00 am

allows time for picture taking, smooches and tears parents can come into the school

Schedules

- Morning drop off 7:30 8:30 am
- School STARTS at 8:30 am students in their seats and ready to learn so PLEASE drop students off by 8:25 am
- Breakfast served 7:45 8:15
- School is out M T W TH at 3:40 pm
- After-school program on M T W TH ends at 4:30 pm
- Short Day is Friday 1:30 pm
- Daily schedules and calendar on our website

FREE Before School Program

MORNING SUPERVISION - DAILY

- 7:30 8:25 am students are in their assign location based on grade level (if they eat breakfast then they go to their location after they have eaten)
 - Kindergarten (North Kiva)
 - 1st (Middle kiva)
 - 2nd grade (Library)
 - 3rd 6th grades (gym)
- Students do NOT play outside, run around, horseplay, etc. They simply sit quietly and watch a movie until 8:25 am

FREE Bridge After School Enrichment (BASE)

- 3:40 4:30 M T W TH
- Dinner served 4:10 4:30 pm
- Students MUST be signed up to attend (link to sign up sent in email and on our website)
 - If you need to make permanent or temporary changes you MUST notify Sara Tucker or call the office
- Students remain in their grade level classroom kindergarten is in North Kiva
- Each day has a different focus
- Students MUST be picked up by 4:30 pm
- If you come earlier you must check your child out from the office

WATCH ME LEARN

- Students rewarded with tickets for exhibiting Visible Learning Traits
- 10 Tickets = one of the following
 - Token for Treasure Tower
 - FREE Dress Down Coupon

- Students may also choose to put tickets in for twice monthly prize drawing

ZERO RIBBITS

- Classes rewarded with PURPLE TICKET for quiet transitions
- Weekly winning class gets FREE Dress Down Day (Wednesday)
- Monthly winners get Purple Ticket Party

Dress Code

- PLAIN Black or tan (khaki) bottoms
 - o Includes shorts, pants, skorts, skirts
- PLAIN colored polo shirt
- Bullfrog Spirit Shirt (next order in November)
- Shoes must be closed toe (no flip flops, sandals, etc.)
 - Lights are okay
 - Wheels are not okay

Assessments

First two weeks students are assessed to determine reading and math levels.

- Acadience (DIBELS) reading and math
- Imagine Learning literacy and math
- ESGI (kindergarten)
- Galileo (1st 6th grades)
- Information shared with parents via a progress report
- Students formally re-assessed in using these same programs in January and May
- RISE (grades 3+) given at end of school year

Advisors and PLP for Grades 1 - 6

- Students in grades 1 6 assigned advisor (assigned teacher in Aspire)
- Advisory period on Friday 8:45 10:45
- Students meet with advisor twice monthly to create reading and math goals, action steps to achieve the goal including things they can do at home to help and then review progress and discuss next steps
- PLP shared digitally with parents via email
- Advisory begins September 10
- Once quarterly parents invited to attend PLP meeting during advisory time
