	Goal: improve student reading, as indicated by improvement of composite test scores by 2%
	Measurement: Acadience software testing scores

State Goal: by 2027, EOY percentage of grade level at "proficient" reading: 70%; LLA Layton is currently 68%. Very close to State Goal

LLA is getting good data capture; the students are performing well even at BOY

Discussion of Current Year Goal

Potential Roadblocks to Achieving the Goal:

- 1. Unfamiliarity with the testing environment causing false low scores
- Lower reading skills overall: there was a methodology shift enacted SY 2023-2024: teachers went from subject-focused teaching (class switching) to class-focused teaching (no class switching). This has allowed teachers to progress-map more incisively and focus on the student as a whole.
- 3. Testing apathy

#### Plans to Overcome Roadblocks:

- Increasing student familiarity with the test itself: frequent testing and progress monitoring – CURRENTLY IN ACTION, students are more relaxed in the testing environment, possibly reducing false low scores
- Increasing student reading skills overall utilizing multiple and holistic methods
  - A. Lexia reading software: technology familiarity and reading skills CURRENTLY IN ACTION
  - B. Classroom Small Groups 4 x a week CURRENTLY IN ACTION
  - C. Ensure equitable treatment by teachers to include high and low performers in f2f instruction CURRENTLY IN ACTION
  - D. Reading buddies: example: 6<sup>th</sup> grade to 2<sup>nd</sup> grade CURRENTLY IN ACTION; this fosters the idea that LLA is a "READING SCHOOL", encourages a reading community through all grades
- 3. Testing apathy is a difficult roadblock.

	Math "Centers": specific stations to teach the unit lesson from multiple levels and perspectives; makes math fun and accessible
	Problems with translating math word problems: hopefully increasing in overall literacy will aid students in word problem mastery
