Student Technology & Computer Use Agreement

Purpose

Bridge Elementary provides students with access to computers, electronic devices, and internet resources to support learning. These tools help students access lessons, complete assignments, collaborate with teachers, and participate in digital learning activities.

Legal Compliance

This agreement complies with Utah Administrative Rule R277-495, the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA), the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), and other applicable federal and state laws related to student privacy and internet safety.

Online Learning Platforms

Students may access lessons, assignments, and projects through online platforms such as Google Classroom, Zoom, and other educational platforms approved by school administration.

Student Responsibilities

- Use technology only for educational purposes.
- Follow directions from teachers and school staff.
- Protect usernames and passwords.
- Respect the privacy and work of other students.
- Report inappropriate or unsafe online activity to a teacher or administrator.
- Do not attempt to bypass school internet filters or security settings.
- Do not access or distribute inappropriate material.

Internet Safety

The school uses internet filtering and monitoring technology to prevent access to inappropriate material and protect students online as required by law.

School Device Checkout (If Applicable)

If a student does not have access to a device or internet service, the school may allow students to check out a device or hotspot. The device remains school property. Parents/guardians may be responsible for repair or replacement costs if devices are lost or damaged due to misuse or negligence.

Cyberbullying and Misuse

Use of school technology to bully, harass, threaten, or intimidate others is prohibited and may result in disciplinary action consistent with Utah Code 53G-9-601.

Monitoring

Student activity on school devices or school networks may be monitored by school staff. There is no expectation of privacy when using school technology resources.
