We are so excited about this upcoming school year. I hope you had some great down time with family this summer and enjoyed some time in the outdoors together. We are so excited to launch a new year at Greenwood. Our theme this year is "Radiate Confidence". Our students are amazing and we want them to know it! This year we are going to focus on building a growth mindset, strengthening resilience, and increasing perseverance. Your children are capable of amazing things. We want to support them to grow socially, emotionally, and academically to be the best version of them that they can be. We are looking forward to seeing the growth in each child. In order to be successful, we need them here.

"Chronic absence measures lost time from learning. It is defined as missing 10 percent or more of the total number of days enrolled during the school year. **Just two days per month can lead to chronic absence.** It includes both excused, unexcused, and out-of-school suspensions. For example, a student who has been enrolled for the first 30 school days at the beginning of the school year and has been absent three of those days is chronically absent. If a student misses 18 days in 1 school year, they will be chronically absent. Being chronically absent has a huge impact on a student's ability to read at grade level, perform academically, and graduate on time. Good attendance can help children do well in school, and eventually in the workplace." (CT.gov, 2025)

Please make sure that your students are here daily and that you are reading with them every night. Attendance and parent support make a huge difference! Please help us to help your student "Radiate Confidence"! We need you. We want to have you volunteer in classrooms, help with fieldwork, be part of our Family Crew Organization (FCO). Be sure to check in with your students about what they are learning and be involved. Together we can make this year at GreenWood the best one yet!
