THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE

Regular school attendance is one of the most important factors in your child's success. When students miss school, even just a day or two here and there, it adds up quickly and can affect both their learning and their confidence.

Why Attendance Matters:

- **Learning builds daily.** Each lesson connects to the next, and missing class makes it harder for students to keep up.
- **Good habits last a lifetime.** Being on time and showing up regularly teaches responsibility and perseverance.
- **Connections are key.** Consistent attendance helps children build friendships, feel part of the class community, and develop stronger relationships with teachers.

Achievement improves. Research shows that students who attend school regularly are more likely to perform well academically and graduate on time.

Together, we can give every child the best opportunity to learn, grow, and succeed!



Mental Health Boost

Hi,
I made the Mental Health newsletter portion about how routine and schedules are important for families and students!
As everyone heads back to school, having a daily routine supports positive mental health. Schedules help reduce stress and anxiety by creating a sense of security and control for your student. Routines also help students manage their time, build healthy habits, and feel more prepared for each day.

How Routine Boosts Mental Health:

- Reduces uncertainty and anxiety by making the day more predictable.
- Encourages healthy habits like regular sleep, healthy meals, reduced screentime, and movement.
- Improves focus and academic performance by setting clear times for work and rest.
- Builds confidence as students learn to manage their time and responsibilities.

Tips for Starting the Year off Strong:

- Set regular sleep and wake times—aim for 8-10 hours of sleep.
- Plan time for breakfast to fuel the day.
- Create a daily homework routine in a quiet, consistent spot for no more than 30 minutes.
- Schedule breaks for movement or relaxation in the evening.
- Wind down at night with a calming activity as a family (reading, music, or gentle stretching).

Pick up and Drop off Norms

Morning Drop-Off

- Pull all the way forward before stopping.
- Have children exit the vehicle immediately.
- If you need extra time to say goodbye, please park.

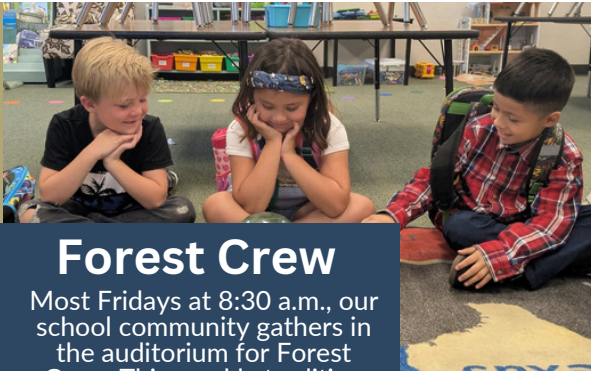

Opening Community Circle Family Night
