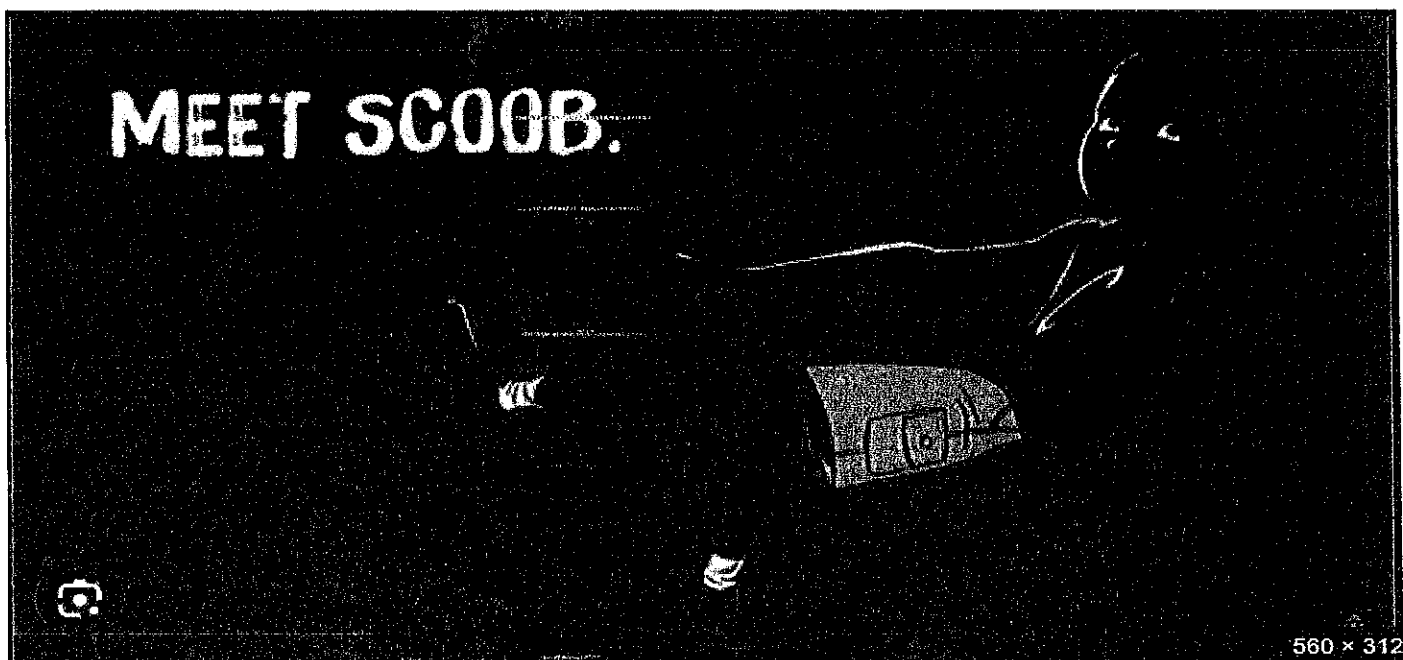

Directions

Complete the following math activities while reading the book. Show your work clearly and explain your thinking when possible.

1. Road Trip Mileage

Scoob and G'ma travel across several states during their road trip.

Problem A

If they drive 245 miles on Monday and 318 miles on Tuesday:

1. How many total miles did they travel?
2. If the trip goal was 700 miles, how many miles do they still need to travel?

Problem B

Gas costs \$3.89 per gallon.

If the RV uses 14 gallons of gas:

1. About how much will it cost to fill up?
2. Estimate first, then calculate the exact answer.

2. Time on the Road

Problem A

Scoob and G'ma leave at 8:35 AM and arrive at a hotel at 2:50 PM.

1. How long were they traveling?
2. If they stopped for lunch for 45 minutes, how much actual driving time did they have?

Problem B

If they average 62 miles per hour for 5 hours, how far did they travel?

Problem B

1. What is the unit rate in miles per gallon?
2. Would you consider this good gas mileage? Explain.

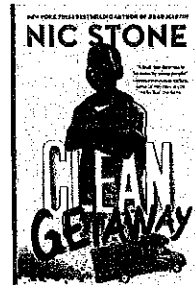
